## News from the news

### Resilience and creativity are at the heart of permaculture

So SLP has become an anarchist publishing and marketing organisation. What a surprise! Not only that, after years of working with its natural contraction I thought it best that I take the bigger picture to heart and focus on those characteristics that will further the group and prepare for a possible expansion in the future; one more akin to earning a proper livelihood making use of available resources that come freely. This is the basis of my latest books *The Carob Pod: An Anthropological Guide to Permaculture* and *Petriarchy: The Law of the Land*. Even though many may not bite the spiritual cake there is a lovely international influence coming in here which puts the British picture into its proper context. Along with these latest publications, the second volume of which will be printed in **journal** format in 7 editions released 3 times a year, and colourful excerpts from that other book I wrote about the trip to Palestine, I am pushing to get the **market** properly running which includes Catalan olive oil, raw carob pods, Zaytoon products, and any other home-grown stuffs that permaculturists want to advertise. This may include preserves, honey, seasonal fruit, fruit trees and shrubs, gifts, and other products. One will get 3 months free advertising (in exchange for 3 first-class stamps) and SLP will get a 10% cut to cover administration fees. The **market** is basic, and so is the website, but without any capital I can't do much more with them.

### Big Tree Plant

**Free trees for  
Lewisham projects**

Dear volunteer groups, public bodies and potential business partnerships, WE have been fortunate to receive funding through the Big Tree Plant scheme which aims to encourage and support community groups to plant trees in neighbourhoods where people live and work. This can include parks, streets, recreational grounds, roof tops, wildlife centers, allotments, water restoration projects, church yards, new public building developments like schools and colleges, libraries, cycle lanes, sports centers, youth centers and hospitals; and private developments like shared housing, shopping malls, art installations and exhibition centers. Fundamentally, all locations must be accessible to the public and require the perpetual maintenance of the trees by one group or another, and may include public authorities, private contractors, and volunteer organizations like afterschool clubs, resident and parent associations, mental and disability organizations, and environmental groups. The scheme has donated 4 million pounds towards the planting of at least 1 million trees throughout the neighbourhoods of Britain, but of course we welcome extra financial support or match funding. Our particular allocation lies within the vicinity of Lewisham Borough in alignment with Pepys Community Forum's own ethical approach. PCF runs projects such as the John Evelyn Community Garden, and the Refugee, Education, Employment and Training Agency (Reeta), both organizations that could only have achieved success with the collaboration of public and private groups

Volunteer opportunities for one or two individuals to help work the land in a beautiful part of Spain. Access to the sea and neighbouring towns, and a shared caravan. Self-catering but many benefits include trips to regional mountainous and valley beauty spots, as well as direct rail services to Valencia, Tarragona and Barcelona. Cycling is a must in this country. The project is the beginnings of an eco-settlement illustrated in the above books. The first phase building the large cistern will progress in May/June. Other learning experiences include dry-stone walling, walking and mountaineering, olive and carob cultivation, and vegetable production. Only companions are sort and must be of a spiritual disposition. Please contact the editor for further details or see our website.

and volunteer participation. We would like to continue this pattern and hope to extend this scheme indefinitely; our current funding will take us into 2015.

WE urge your immediate approval and collaboration. Much of the ground work occurs during the winter especially with the planting up of hedges consisting of blackthorn and hawthorn. Our remit is for the planting of 480 trees per year (ending March) and requires their implementation in small groups. This cannot be more so apparent than in urban environments where old orchards have given way to concrete, steel and tarmac. The recent wet weather of spring 2012 is proof of this, having decimated the apple and pear crop in Britain, and this year looks to follow a similar pattern. Since much

of our work entails helping the needy we will prioritize applications for trees by groups who fulfill the following criteria:

- Reside in Lewisham Borough**
- Have an active interest in maintaining trees**
- Have permission and access to public land**
- Have a long-term vision for the tree's life**
- Will instigate a maintenance program for the trees with or without the collaboration of partner groups**
- Realize the importance of green neighbourhoods**
- Are willing to learn about horticulture and general fruit propagation**

On this last point PCF will use its outreach program to educate and run workshops on tree maintenance, espe-

cially with fruit tree production. Also, the whole process is to encourage the promotion of life itself and should involve the periodic awareness of the cycle of the tree, for instance, incorporating apple days, creating specific commemorative tree planting events, and collecting materials for education and generation of new stock. PCF and associate groups will assist and provide all initial materials and expertise on the subject but realize the importance of putting in place the long-term application of support groups. Please contact us immediately with:

- 1 - The landowner permission, as a written letter on headed paper addressed to PCF.
- 2 - A commitment to 'aftercare' provision for the trees, again in a written form.
